The service on Sunday was conducted by the Worship Team, led by Hazel Paterson, as Rev. Rosslyn Duncan is on leave.

The children's address entitled "Double Vision" was done using two camel puppets called Camile and Clyde. The children enjoyed the talk and so did many of the adults in the congregation.

Alan Cairnduff read from Samuel 16 vs 1-13 and John 9 vs 1-6; 35-41. The texts from the book of John were the basis of the Reflection by Hazel. This is the story of the man who was blind from birth and was healed by Jesus. The man was asked by many who had healed him but he said he did not know. They did not believe him and shunned him. Jesus heard about this and went looking for the man and asked him if he believed in "the Son of Man". He wanted to know who this was so that he could believe and Jesus told him that it was him. The man confessed to believe and worshipped Him. Jesus told the man that He had come into the world so that the blind may see and those who see would become blind.

The message in this, is that, we too are blind until we can accept and believe in Jesus Christ and spread the word to everyone else.
